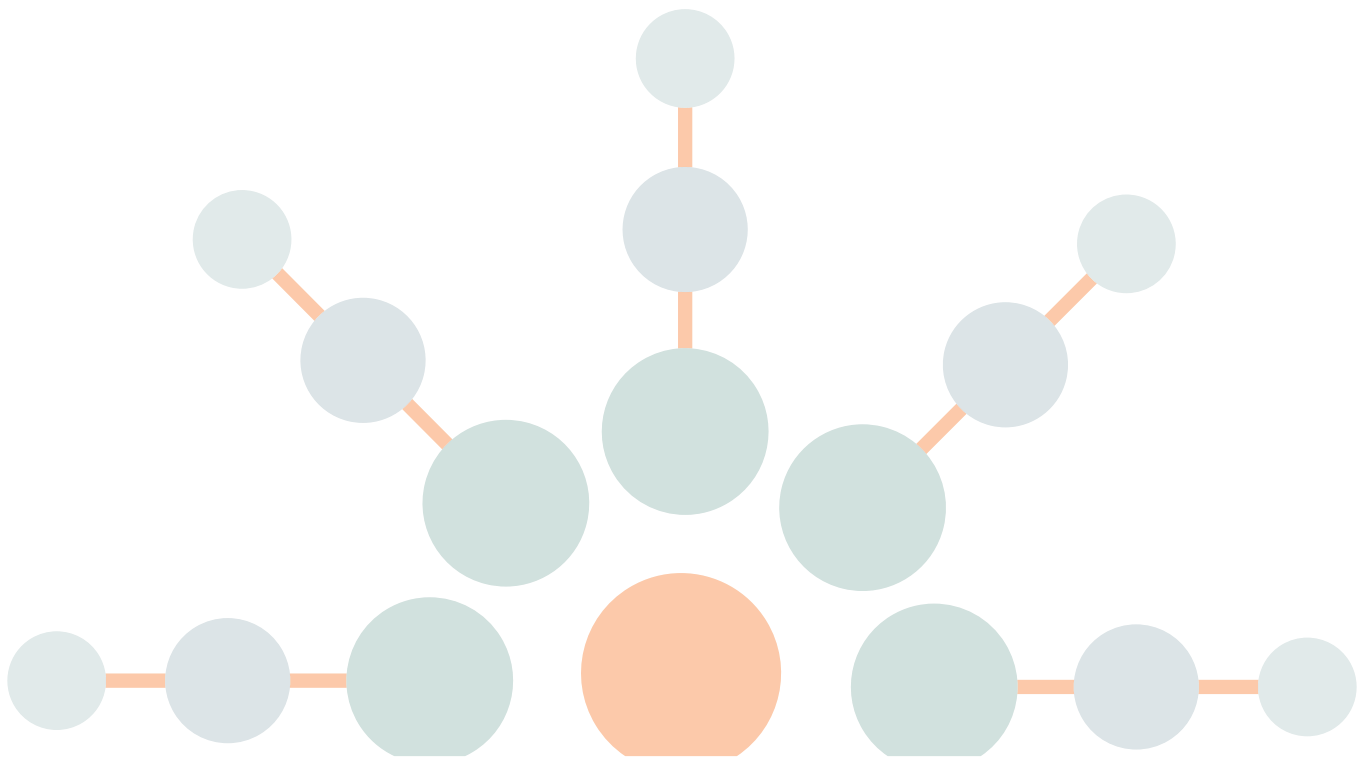

### **Professor Martyn Caplin BSc, (HONS), DM, FRCP**

Professor Martyn Caplin is Professor of Gastroenterology & G.I. Neuroendocrinology at the Royal Free Hospital and University College London. He was recently elected chairman of the European Neuroendocrine Tumor Society and was the chairman of the National Cancer Research Institute Neuroendocrine Tumour Committee, as well as past chairman of the UK & Ireland Neuroendocrine Tumour Society. He received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the UK & Ireland Neuroendocrine Tumour Society for his clinical leadership and research in the field of NETs. He has a large research programme investigating the biology of NETs, developing new prognostic/diagnostic markers and investigating new targets for therapy.

## Nearest underground station
